



Pronunciation Tip for Non-Swahili Speakers

Swahili has five vowels: a, e, i, o, u. the vowels are pronounced as follows:

A - ah (Like the "a" in "father")

E - eh (Like the "e" in "egg")

I - ee (Like the "ee" in "bee")

O - oh (Like the "o" in "pot")

U - oo (Like the "oo" in "book")
